Giving young girls the opportunity to navigate outside of their homes and schools is a great way to build the needed independence and resilience for their tomorrows.

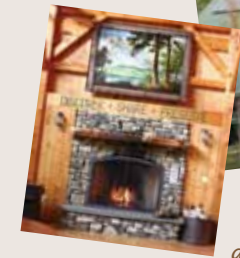
Please help us spread the word and educate others about these values that are less visible but at the core of the Wyonegonic Experience.

WYO Green goes Greener with Solar

A solar photovoltaic electricity generating system has been installed at the Cobb Dining Hall. The system went online on October 18. It is designed to generate 110% of the anticipated annual electricity demand at the Cobb Dining Hall. During the first day of operation under cloudy conditions, the sun still generated a total of 17,014 watts of electricity. This produced the equivalent of saving 37 pounds of carbon emissions. We are looking forward to seeing the results of our first sunny day and will incorporate this project into summer learning for campers next season.
