

2014 CAMP SEASON: Wyonegonic opens Wednesday, June 25 and closes Tuesday, August 12. Midseason changeover is Saturday, July 19, 2014.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE: Please send the completed registration with \$500 deposit. Registrations are time-sensitive and available space will be confirmed upon receipt.

Returning campers are guaranteed a space for the 2014 season by returning a completed registration form and deposit by November 1, 2013. Session changes for returning campers can be requested for consideration but are not guaranteed, unless space is available.

UNIT ASSIGNMENT: Final cabin assignments are determined in June. Junior Camp: 3rd – 5th grades; Intermediate Camp: 6th – 7th grades; Senior Camp: 8th – 10th grades.

TUITION: Tuition not only covers room, board, program and staff instruction, but also postage, laundry, bedding, sundries, camp picture poster, address book, special transportation for out-of-camp trips, horseback riding, and health center care in camp. Any applicable taxes will be billed in 2014.

TUITION REFUND POLICY: \$100 of the \$500 deposit is a service charge and non-refundable. The balance of \$400 is refundable if Wyonegonic is notified before February 1, 2014. There are no deposit refunds after February 1. No reduction is made for late arrivals or early departures. Participation is encouraged for the entire time of the session dates. In the event of absence from Wyonegonic due to illness for a period of more than two weeks, financial loss will be shared equally between the camp and parents.

7 WEEK TUITION: All inclusive <u>tuition of \$8200</u> is payable as follows:

\$500 deposit with registration form \$3850 due March 1, 2014 \$3850 due May 1, 2014

A reduced tuition of \$7850 is honored for full payment received by November 1, 2013. A reduced tuition of \$8000 is honored for full payment received by December 31, 2013.

3 1/2 WEEK TUITION: All inclusive <u>tuition of \$5350</u> is payable as follows:

\$500 deposit with registration form \$2425 due March 1, 2014 \$2425 due May 1, 2014

A reduced tuition fee of \$5150 is honored for full payment received by November 1, 2013. A reduced tuition fee of \$5250 is honored for full payment received by December 31, 2013.

CAMPER HEALTH FORMS are mandatory for all campers. This includes completion of an online Health History Form completed by the parent and a health exam form completed by a physician. A copy of your insurance card (both sides please) need to be on record at the Health Center. Individual prescription medication must be arranged through *CampRX* which provides prepackaged medications for dispensing.

FOOTLOCKERS: Campers need a footlocker for everyday living in their cabins. Footlockers can be shipped in advance or brought to camp on opening day. Campers may rent footlockers from Wyonegonic for \$50, *if arrangements are made in advance*.

BEDDING: A pillow, bed linens, and wool blankets will be provided by the camp. We suggest your child bring a sleeping bag for trips.

CAMP CLOTHING: Wyonegonic campers and counselors wear forest green or white shirts and green, white or tan khaki shorts. Camp clothing can be purchased through *Amerasport*, our official outfitter. Their order form will be sent in February and is also accessible at www.amerasport.com. All clothing and personal items must be plainly marked with the camper's full name. Name tapes are a necessity.

INTERNATIONAL INFORMATION: When arranging flights, fly on June 24 or July 18 into Boston; fly home on July 19 or August 12. Footlockers may be purchased through our official outfitter and used for winter storage at camp. No footlockers are shipped out of the country at the end of the season. Payment for tuition/travel fees must be drawn from a USA bank or Visa/MasterCard.

VISITORS: Parents are welcome to visit ten days after your child arrives. One visit is permitted each session. If you wish to take your OWN child out of camp for a meal, contact the office to make advance arrangements with the Camp Directors. Weather permitting, parents and guests are invited to the Saturday evening camp cookout. Parents who visit during the week may join us for buffet lunch.

COMMUNICATION: Weekly summer newsletters are sent electronically. Please make sure we have record of the best e-mail address for camp administrative communication and place info@wyonegonic.com in your address book.

TELEPHONE / FAX: Campers are not permitted to use the telephone. An exception is made for camper birthdays where the parent may call during meal times. Parents are welcome to call the Camp Directors. Use of the FAX is for camp business only.

EMAIL: Camp office email addresses are for camp business, not camper correspondence. Parents can set up an account through Bunk1 in order to send an email to campers, and/or subscribe to an optional reply system.

WINTER REUNIONS: Joint reunions with our brother camp, Winona, are held during the school year. Prospective and current families, alumnae and friends are cordially invited to bring guests. For a complete listing of reunion locations and dates, please visit our website at www.wyonegonic.com

TRAVEL: Detailed travel instructions will be sent to all registered campers in March. Independent flights are met by Wyonegonic and Winona representatives in Boston, MA and Portland, ME. Wyonegonic and Winona representatives will also chaperone campers from Southern Connecticut by bus or van.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING: Wyonegonic has a two-year leadership training program for 16 to 18 year old girls. For further information about the program and special tuition, please contact the Camp Directors.

FAMILY CAMP: At the close of the regular camper season, Wyonegonic welcomes families. Parents and their children may sign up to enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of Wyonegonic and participate in camp activities such as swimming, hiking, canoeing, sailing, sail boarding, waterskiing, tennis and archery. Meals are served family style in the camp dining hall and families stay in cabins. A Family Camp registration form is available online at www. wyonegonic.com

WINONA: Our brother camp Winona, owned and operated separately, is located five miles from Wyonegonic on the same lake. Since many brother-sister campers attend camps, Winona and Wyonegonic plan the same dates for the camp season, winter reunions, and brother-sister visitations during the summer.
