As educators and parents we know that two essential components of raising children are love and structure. At Wyonegonic we intentionally plan, train and orchestrate with these two thoughts in mind.

We are proud that we have spent over a century - our 111th consecutive summer - successfully providing a summer of safe, age appropriate and memorable experiences for children and staff. We are pleased to be able to serve generations of families, as well as multiple siblings from the same family. With few exceptions we have been able to serve all the children accepted for our program. As alumnae become mothers and grandmothers we often receive letters that relay details about camp conversations that speak to "their best summers ever, were spent at Wyonegonic." We are grateful for all the letters of appreciation and praise expressing satisfaction for our efforts. We have every intention of continuing care with the same concerns, interest and energy.

In part the success of our program is based on:

- High standards of care for children
- High expectations for staff and ourselves
- A value system explained to families, staff and campers
- Boundaries clearly defined for all residents in camp

During Pre-Camp Training with staff we talk about keeping the well-being of our campers, both physically and emotionally, as our top priority. Wyonegonic is a community and a family.

We attempt to teach campers to:

- Recognize that they have responsibility for themselves and those around them
- Respect themselves and others in spite of differences
- Learn to make choices and to take responsibility for the choices they make
- Accept that they are accountable for their actions

Some of these exposures can influence behavioral development, but we have stood firm with our expectations for behavior. We continue to provide an experience based on simple living in the out-of-doors with a focus on people and appreciation of the environment. In a nutshell, our focus ties back to love and structure.

It is our intent and interest to offer pleasant memories, fun and learning for every camper. We rely on parents providing us

with pertinent and necessary information so we can keep all children safe. As caretakers of children we strive to maintain a strong partnership with our camp parents.

We look forward to summer 2012. The ice is leaving Moose Pond early and we expect to get into camp property sooner than usual with the mild winter almost behind us.






