**2018 CAMP SEASON: Wyonegonic opens Wednesday, June 27 and closes Tuesday, August 14.
Midseason changeover is Saturday, July 21, 2018.**

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE: Please send the completed registration with \$500 deposit. Registrations are time-sensitive and available space will be confirmed upon receipt.

Returning campers are guaranteed a space for the 2018 season by returning a completed registration form and deposit by November 1, 2017. Session changes for returning campers can be requested for consideration but are not guaranteed, unless space is available.

TUITION: Tuition not only covers room, board, program and staff instruction, but also postage, laundry, bedding, sundries, camp picture poster, address book, special transportation for out-of-camp trips, horseback riding, and health center care in camp. Any applicable taxes will be billed in 2018.

7 WEEK TUITION: All inclusive tuition of \$8950 is payable as follows:

\$500 deposit with registration form
\$4225 due March 1, 2018
\$4225 due May 1, 2018

A reduced tuition of \$8500 is honored for full payment received by November 1, 2017. A reduced tuition of \$8650 is honored for full payment received by December 31, 2017.

3 1/2 WEEK TUITION: All inclusive tuition of \$5950 is payable as follows:

\$500 deposit with registration form
\$2725 due March 1, 2018
\$2725 due May 1, 2018

A reduced tuition fee of \$5650 is honored for full payment received by November 1, 2017. A reduced tuition fee of \$5800 is honored for full payment received by December 31, 2017.

TUITION REFUND POLICY: \$100 of the \$500 deposit is a service charge and non-refundable. The balance of \$400 is refundable if Wyonegonic is notified before February 1, 2018. There are no deposit refunds after February 1. No reduction is made for late arrivals or early departures. Participation is encouraged for the entire time of the session dates. In the event of absence from Wyonegonic due to illness for a period of more than two weeks, financial loss will be shared equally between the camp and parents.

CAMPER HEALTH FORMS are mandatory for all campers. This includes completion of an online Health History Form completed by the parent and a health exam form completed by a physician. A copy of your insurance card (both sides) must be on record at the Health Center. Individual prescription and OTC medication must be approved by a physician; and must be arranged through Wyonegonic's preferred vendor for prepackaged medications for dispensing.

UNIT ASSIGNMENT: Final cabin assignments are determined prior to camper arrival. Junior Camp: 3rd – 5th grades; Intermediate Camp: 6th – 7th grades; Senior Camp: 8th – 10th grades.

FOOTLOCKERS: Campers need a footlocker for everyday living in their cabins. They may be shipped to camp via courier or UPS. You can set up your account with Wyonegonic's preferred vendor for delivery and pick-up. Campers may rent them from Wyonegonic for \$50, *if arrangements are made in advance*.

BEDDING: A pillow, bed linens, and wool blankets will be provided by the camp. We suggest your child bring a sleeping bag for trips.

CAMP CLOTHING: Wyonegonic campers and counselors wear forest green or white shirts and green, white or tan khaki shorts. Camp clothing can be purchased through *Amerasport*, our official outfitter. Their order form will be sent in February and is also accessible at www.amerasport.com. All clothing and personal items must be plainly marked with the camper's full name. Name tapes are a necessity.

INTERNATIONAL and WESTERN US STATES INFORMATION: When arranging flights, fly on June 26 or July 20 into Boston; fly home on July 21 or August 14. Footlockers may be purchased through our preferred outfitter and used for winter storage at camp. No footlockers are shipped out of the country at the end of the season. Payment for tuition/travel fees must be drawn from a USA bank or Visa/MasterCard.

VISITORS: Parents are welcome to visit ten days after your child arrives. One visit is permitted each session. Contact the office in advance to take your camper out of camp for a meal or family time. Overnight visits are not permitted. Taking friends out of camp is not permitted. Parents and guests are invited to the Saturday evening camp cookout. Parents who visit during the week may join us for buffet lunch.

COMMUNICATION: Weekly summer newsletters are sent electronically. Please make sure we have the best email address for camp administrative communications and place info@wyonegonic.com in your address book to ensure receiving camp email.

TELEPHONE / FAX: Campers are not permitted to use the telephone. Camper birthdays are the exception. We suggest parents call during meal times. Parents are welcome to call the Camp Directors for updates. Use of the FAX is for camp business only.

EMAIL: Camp office email addresses are for camp business, not camper correspondence. Parents can set up an account through the parent log-in system to send e-mail communications to their camper(s).

WINTER REUNIONS: Joint reunions with our brother camp, Winona, are held during the school year. Prospective and current families, alumnae and friends are cordially invited to bring guests. For a complete listing of reunion locations and dates, please visit our website at www.wyonegonic.com

TRAVEL: Detailed travel instructions will be sent to all registered campers in March. Independent flights are met by Wyonegonic and Winona representatives in Boston, MA and Portland, ME. Wyonegonic and Winona representatives will also chaperone campers from Southern Connecticut by bus charter.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING: Wyonegonic has a two-year leadership training program for 16 to 18 year old girls. For further information about the program and special tuition, please contact the Camp Directors.

FAMILY CAMP: At the close of the regular camper season, Wyonegonic welcomes families. Parents and their children may sign up to enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of Wyonegonic and participate in camp activities such as swimming, hiking, canoeing, sailing, windsurfing, waterskiing, tennis and archery. Meals are served family style in the camp dining hall and families stay in cabins. A Family Camp registration form is available online at www.wyonegonic.com

WINONA: Our brother camp Winona, owned and operated separately, is located five miles from Wyonegonic on the same lake. Since many brother-sister campers attend camps, Winona and Wyonegonic share the same dates for the camp season, winter reunions, and arrange brother-sister visitations during the summer.
