Whether it is a hike up a mountain, or slicing your bow across white caps on a lake or meandering down a Maine river, campers have tales to tell when they return to camp from their wilderness trips. The experience does not fade away and often motivates them to conquer other outdoor challenges. Some of these experiences are a day trip and most are between 2-5 days out in the wilderness. Their trip leaders are a catalyst and very important to the quality of the experience. Wyonegonic hires 8 trip leaders each summer who are well trained and certified to lead campers in the small group setting.


