



# A Look at Earlier Days

## First Impressions

*"Brownfield, Brownfield!" called the brakeman loudly and we all rushed for the door, clutching madly our bags and other paraphernalia. We were hot, dusty, and tired and I am sure we looked up as we stepped off the platform. We waded inches deep in sand over to a nearby carriage trying to assume the expression on our heated brows of having been accustomed to come to Wyonegonic for many, many years. But in reality, we merely followed the crowd.*

*So thus it happened some of us rode to Denmark in a carriage instead of seizing the first auto the minute we got off the train. I really suppose it was too much to expect to find Wyonegonic just around the corner from Brownfield station. We had naturally supposed our journey to be practically ended when we reached that metropolis but we were mistaken.*

*We soon found that our next stopping place was Denmark Inn. Upon the drivers remarking that it was only a little ways we expected to see the world famous Denmark Inn loom up in view on almost any hill. But no such spectacle greeted our anxious eyes. Finally when we had decided that that building was only in dreamland our jovial driver, wildly pointed with his whip to a large yellow building in the distance, saying, "That there's the Inn."*

*We dug ourselves out of the layers of dirt which enveloped us and climbed down from the carriage to join the many girls on the piazza who were surrounded by much baggage.*

*After a little while when everyone had arrived in either carriages or autos, we picked up our luggage and started for the boathouse to embark for camp.*

*It was a blessed relief after our tiring trip to be on the water. How refreshing to sit idly in the boat and dabble one's fingers in the water. I leaned back to watch the scenery as we wound our way through the narrow stream. Suddenly rounding a point of land the stream broadened and we beheld a large mountain and several smaller peaks. The sun was getting low and as we looked along the opposite shore that we were rapidly approaching we saw a group of brown tents partly hidden among the tall, straight pines.*

*When we landed, we were shown to what seemed at first, very close quarters, but it was such fun to be with girls that we immediately forgot our city life with its luxuries, and gave ourselves up to the natural out-of-door life we were to have.*

*A whistle soon summoned us to supper at the Wigwam. It was beautiful to look out on the lake and see the very brilliant glow of the sunset on the water while we hungrily feasted.*

*At last we were tucked into our cots. As we lay there, we could look out into the dark night lighted only by the faint silvery beams of the moon, all silent save for the quiet ripple of the waves on the shore and the distant call of the loons. And each one of us was just beginning to realize what a happy summer was before us.*

Enrollment update: As of the end of October we have 135 campers enrolled for next summer. Wyonegonic guarantees a 2015 camper's space if enrolled by November 1. We are proud of our very high return rate of previous years' campers.

We dialog daily with prospective families that have visited camp or expressed interest by phone or email. We are pleased that many new families have enrolled in our younger age groups. We welcome discussions with any interested families with campers of all ages, and are actively enrolling campers on a first come first serve basis.

For campers going into grades 7-10 returnees and requests for upgrade to full season are quite high. As changes occur and space becomes available, we take names off a wait list that is managed by the date we initially get a commitment from the family.


